Have you or a loved one been a victim of crime? Help is available

In the aftermath of crime, life is different – Crime leaves us all at a loss – whether through injury, financial loss, loss of a loved one or emotional trauma. No one expects to be victimized. This shouldn't have happened to you or your family.

I feel angry....guilty...ashamed...afraid

You may expect some or all of these reactions:

- Grief and sorrow for what was lost
- Fear for your safety
- Guilt over thinking that somehow you might have prevented the crime
- Anger towards the offender or the criminal justice system
- Neglected by the court system if you don't know what's happening

How can I get help?

1. Call someone you trust for support. To speak with a victim advocate call (507) 328-7270.
2. Call the police to report the crime. An advocate can be with you when you make a report to police. Call (507) 328-7270.



3. Ask the court to order the offender to have no contact with you. An advocate can assist you in filing a restraining order. Call (507) 328-7270.

4. Reach out for assistance to help you deal with the emotional aftermath of the crime. Call (507) 328-7270 to speak with an advocate who can put you in touch with a professional counselor if you desire.

A victim advocate can also help with the following matters:

1. Inform you of your rights as a crime victim and assure those rights are protected.

2. Keep you informed about the progress of your case in the criminal justice system.

3. Assist you in relating the impact of the crime to the prosecutor, probation officer and/or judge on the case.

4. Assist you in applying for financial assistance such as emergency assistance, restitution for lost or stolen property, and reparations for medical bills etc.

5. Inform you of post-sentencing matters such as notification of the release of the offender from custody, obtaining restraining orders and collecting restitution ordered.
